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# UNDERSTANDING THIS STUDY GUIDE

Welcome to the series, Life - The Journey of Real Life Catholics. We're so glad you've joined us.

Here are the nuts and bolts of this study guide:



## **CONNECTING TOGETHER**

This reminds us to ask each other that simple question, "How're you doing?" It gives each person a chance to share life from the last time you were together, to share how you've grown each day. This is the key to building true friendship (Sirach 6:14 - 17).

#### MAIN THEME & AND VERSE(S)

There is a main theme and key scripture verse (or more) for each session.



#### SIMPLE SUMMARY

Each session includes a simple summary of the video lessons. If it works for your group, watch the last video lesson from a session together and follow along with the outline. Look back through the outline during your discussion when it helps. The outline is not meant to be read out loud during your group; rather, it is meant to jog your memory to help your group have meaningful conversations. Ideally, everyone in your group will have engaged the material each day before you get together.



#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

Each session includes a few questions for group discussion. They are meant to be a guide to get the conversation started in your group don't feel like you need to ask every question in this section! They are suggestions, not a formula. As long as you're having meaningful conversation, you're on the right track. Also, feel free to adjust the questions to fit the needs of *your* group, at *your* time.



## **PUTTING IT TO PRACTICE**

Since we become what we repeatedly do, we must choose our habits wisely. Each session will help you close the gap between what you know and what you do.



#### PRAYER

At the end of each session are suggestions for your group prayer. Don't skip this: a Christian stands and falls with prayer...our minds were made for prayer, and it is a precondition for any level of holiness.

## **CONNECTING TOGETHER**

Be sure everyone has a chance to introduce themselves and to share a bit about their hopes for this journey together. Check in on how people are really doing...and listen for how they've been growing (or not) in their faith.



## **MAIN THEME & VERSE(S)**

**Key Theme:** The power of beauty to evangelize, when we open ourselves up to it.

For all people who were ignorant of God were foolish by nature; and they were unable from the good things that are seen to know the one who exists, nor did they recognize the artisan while paying heed to his works; but they supposed that either fire or wind or swift air, or the circle of the stars, or turbulent water, or the luminaries of heaven were the gods that rule the world. If through delight in the beauty of these things people assumed them to be gods, let them know how much better than these is their Lord, for the author of beauty created them. - Wisdom 13:1-3

## SIMPLE SUMMARY

#### **CHRIS' INTRO**

In this episode, we got to take a remarkable look at how the beauty of God, our creator, is all around us. Every culture throughout history has believed in God or gods because they knew they came from something bigger than themself.

As Christians, we don't believe that God is a mythological creature floating around in space. That would be like a character leaving a book wondering why they can't see the author. The fact of the matter is that we are IN God's love story.

God writes a message to us in His word, but He's also written a message in all of creation. And it shouts to us that there is a God. But more than that, it also gives us insight to who He is.

The light of reason shows us that there is a God. The light of faith shows us who God is. God is LOVE. God made all of this for us. And why did He do this? Because love is extravagant. The story of salvation is a story of love. And this love story culminates on the cross...for you.

When Natalie was questioning all things in life, natural beauty was the closest thing she could find to the divine.

Family... the central theme to the Hawaiian culture. It's also the central theme to the Christian life. YOU are part of God's family.



## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. A mind-blowing fact is that God isn't contained in the universe, but rather that the universe is contained within God. What aspect of creation is most fascinating or beautiful to you? How does it point you to the heart of our divine Creator?
- 2. We heard in this episode that the greatest adventure is the spiritual one. Is this the case for you? If so, take a moment and share the greatest adventures of your spiritual journey so far. If not, why not?
- 3. People often say "I'm spiritual, not religious." Well, the devil is also spiritual and not religious... In your opinion, is religion under attack today? What's your personal view of religion?
- 4. All of creation is like a finger pointing to God...Or maybe it's more like God's arms reaching down and wrapping around us. We experience this most powerfully when we make time for Him. What can you do to make even a little more time for God this coming week?
- 5. We heard it said that God's heart is like a riptide. You pass by and you feel God pulling you in and calling you to act. Is there something that you have felt recently compelled by God to do? If so... share! And then act!



## **PUTTING IT TO PRACTICE**

Sometimes we sell God short. Sometimes the pace of our lives are so frantic we miss the beauty of His wonderful creation. Sometimes we forget that He made all of this for us! Sometimes we question the reality of God. Sometimes we forget that we are an important member of the family of God and that we need one another. So this coming week:

Take some moments to stop and simply be still in God's glorious creation.

If you have questions about God, ask Him honestly. Get to the heart of your Creator. And don't be afraid to share these questions with someone you trust as well.

Have the courage to reach out to a family member or friend that you think might be in some need of help. Or if you are in need, have the humility to seek out help. Never forget that family is at the heart of God's creation. And family always has each other's back.

Which of these Putting It To Practice challenges will be the hardest to do? Why?



## PRAYER

As you close in prayer, start by marveling at the glory of God revealed in creation.

Then ask God to reveal to you the gaps in your faith. Ask him to shed light on questions and doubts that have hidden in the darkness of your heart. Ask him to speak truth into your life.

Finally, ask God to move you to joyfully and courageously enter into the family of God. Ask Him how he wants you to use the unique gifts He has given you to make his creation a better place.

Engage this session with a heart of gratitude. You'll unlock the secret to true friendship. Encourage the group to share a blessing that they are thankful for.



## **MAIN THEME & VERSE(S)**

**Key Theme:** Jesus Christ: fully God and fully man, and the joy of pilgrimage to Him.

♣ *Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened.* - Luke 2:15

For God so loved the world, that He gave his one and only Son so that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. - John 3:16



## **SIMPLE SUMMARY**

This episode is set in the Holy Land. It's a place that turns the stories we hear in the Bible from a fairy tale to reality. The fact of the matter is that Jesus was a real person who walked the face of the earth just like me and you!

Jerusalem shouts religion! And religion is at the heart of what it means to be human.

The door that leads into the Bethlehem Basilica is called the Door of \_\_\_\_\_\_. It requires all who enter to bend down just like God bent low, humbled Himself, and became human like us.

The tomb of Jesus, our leader and Lord, is an \_\_\_\_\_\_ tomb.

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

# SO THE LAST WILL BE FIRST, AND THE FIRST WILL BE LAST

**MATTHEW 20:16** 



- 1. In this episode, we got a glimpse of what a pilgrimage to the Holy Land would be like. It's been said the Holy Land is the Fifth Gospel. How do you think a journey there could make your faith come alive?
- 2. Stop and consider the fact that Jesus was a REAL human being. He walked, talked, sang, laughed, cried, wept, and danced. From what you know about Jesus from Scripture... what do you think Jesus was like on a personal level? Engage in some deep conversation about his qualities and personality. Let your mind dive deep into a conversation about the humanity of Jesus Christ.
- 3. Christians in the Holy Land today face considerable persecution. While the level of persecution might not be as great for us...do you ever face challenges by being a Christian? Are these struggles more subtle or inyour-face? Do you even let these pressures get in the way of you living out the faith?
- 4. While a pilgrimage to the Holy Land might be a bit difficult to plan in the short term... is there a more local pilgrimage that you could make as a group? Brainstorm about how you could make a journey of faith together.

## **PUTTING IT TO PRACTICE**

Jesus came to this earth to be with you. He invites you to be with us too. Our lives are a journey to Him. Hopefully one day you can make it to see where he walked on this earth over 2,000 years ago! But until that day, strive to make daily journeys to Him. One of the great adventures we can make as Catholics is the journey to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in prayer. So for the next week, commit to making a daily pilgrimage of prayer. Fill out this chart SPECIFICALLY so that you know the roadmap of your journey...

#### PRAYER PILGRIMAGE

- When will you pray? Set a specific time of the day. Put this in your calendar! If we aren't intentional about when we pray, it's so easy to push it to the side.
- Where will you pray? Find a spot that is set apart from the rest of your daily life. Maybe it's in a church or chapel? Or maybe it's as simple as a chair is a cozy part of your home. No matter what, set aside a sacred space that is reserved for you and Jesus.
- How will you pray? Will you read Scripture? A devotional? Daily readings? Pray the rosary? Journal? No matter what... make sure you employ the 50/50 principle of prayer... you do half the talking and then let God talk the rest... and make sure you listen!

We all need accountability with prayer. Before you go your separate ways, pick a prayer partner with who you will share your Prayer Pilgrimage with who will encourage you to commit to your plan you have made for this week.

Spoiler Alert... hopefully, this habit of your Prayer Pilgrimage will go BEYOND this week! So make sure it's realistic and manageable. Recall the wise words of Fr. John Chapman... "pray as you can, not as you can't!"



## PRAYER

As you close in prayer, start by thanking God for humbling Himself and becoming like us on this earth.

Then... ask Him to specifically guide you on this journey of the next week of your life. Call upon the Holy Spirit to guide and enlighten you on your way.

Finally, ask God to move your heart to be a vessel of his love to the world.

\_\_\_\_\_\_ is the epicenter of some of the greatest sufferings in the recent centuries. The people of this nation continually rose up despite the great trials they have faced.

Here's an unmistakable spiritual law for you: Heroic souls are only chiseled out from the rest of us from \_\_\_\_\_\_. The Polish saints of our era are epic spiritual heroes who fought for the future of humanity.

#### CANNONIZED SAINTS AND SAINTS IN THE MAKING

World Youth Days account for the biggest gathering in multiple host nation's history! Millions come from around the world to come together in the name of Jesus Christ and His Catholic Church. We had the opportunity to meet a few of these Real Life Catholics from all around the world while we also heard about a few of the most heroic souls who have paved the way for us.

#### Christina Shabo - Iraqi-American Pilgrim

Christina came to realize from a still, small voice inside that she needed to turn back to the faith.

It was in adoration that she took everything to Jesus and He took the anger of her past sufferings and softened her heart to be more open to His love and mercy.

#### St. Faustina - Divine Mercy

God said that His mercy is like an \_\_\_\_\_. There's no limit to his mercy for us and there's no sin he can't forgive.

Our truct is like a bucket. The more truct we have the more more way

John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and established the Sunday after Easter "Divine Mercy Sunday."

#### Tom Landgrell - Australian Catholic

Tom's faith was first really tested when he unexpectedly lost his sister when she was 23 years old.

His sister had a deep devotion to St. Faustina and Divine Mercy. Through the passing of his sister, Tom and his entire family discovered and leaned up the beauty of Divine Mercy.

Through this tragedy, Tom's faith was solidified.

#### St. Stanislaus

St. Stanislaus was an 11th-century bishop who stood up to his king and encouraged him to turn from his sinful ways. Tragically, he was brutally murdered by the king himself for standing up for the values of a holy life.

BECOME WHO YOU ARE.

#### St. John Paul II

John Paul II lost everything and everyone by the time he was 21. He experienced how fragile life could be and also witnessed firsthand the capacity that humans had for evil. But instead of becoming cynical and bitter, John Paul II stood up and became the light of Christ to so many in the world.

ST. JOHN PAUL II

Sometimes we're so afraid we forget to live. The power of God always has our back. Be not afraid... open wide the doors for Christ!

#### David Helsner - Polish Catholic

David's life has been beautifully inspired by the life of St. Pope John Paul II. David lost his family for all practical purposes when he was a child and became an orphan.

He dove deeply into the faith. John Paul II gave him hope and was a spiritual father for him.

"Hope in spite of everything... be not tempted to give up... live courageously... be faithful... be not afraid." - St. John Paul II

#### St. Maximillian Kolbe

St. Maximilian Kolbe had a profound encounter with the Blessed Virgin when he was a troubled child. Mary appeared to him and showed him two crowns... one for chastity and one for martyrdom. When she told him to pick one... he heroically picked both.

St. Maximilian Kolbe literally laid down his life in Auschwitz so that a man could live to take care of his wife and kids. That's the definition of faith in action.

His last act was to \_\_\_\_\_\_ the men who executed him. That's the definition of heroically loving thy enemies.

#### **CHRIS' WORLD YOUTH DAY TALK**

Pope Francis has commissioned us all to be "Apostles of Mercy" for Jesus Christ.

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. We heard powerful stories of Real Life Catholics. Which story of a canonized saint spoke most to you? Which story of a saint-in-the-making hit you the most? Why do you think these particular stories resonated with your heart?
- 2. You are called to be a saint! That's what you were created for. That's your destiny. But you truly believe that? Be honest with yourself and with your group and share why you may or may not truly believe that. If you have some doubt... trust in the people in your group to speak truth into your life!
- 3. The fact of the matter is that this life is a "saint-making machine." And we learned that the souls of the most heroic saints are chiseled out of suffering. What have been the biggest sufferings in your life? How have you (or haven't you) used these moments to be drawn to the loving heart of God?
- 4. Do you have a particular devotion to a saint? If so, share with the group why that is! We're all a family of believers and we can help encourage each other to strive to the eternal glory we were made for.



## **PUTTING IT TO PRACTICE**

- Pretend for a moment that your life was going to end in 24 hours... what changes would you need to make? Take some time to analyze where you are at in life and where you would like to go?
- What's one thing you would like to change about your relationship with God?
- What's one human relationship that you would like to heal?
- Do you need to ask for forgiveness from someone? Should you accept forgiveness from somebody?
- When is the last time you have been to Reconciliation? If it's been more than a year, what's been holding you back from receiving the grace of this sacrament?



## PRAYER

Before you close in prayer, take a few moments and jot down one affirmation of each person in your group. Go around and share these! While it might be a little uncomfortable, it's important for us to see the goodness in ourselves.

After this, go around and share one (or more) particular intentions that you would like for your group to live up in prayer. Prayer is at the heart of our relationship. We're called to be saints and are an important member of the communion of saints! Don't be afraid to rely on one another.

Closing Prayer: Jesus, open up our hearts that rivers of living water can flow from me and give hope and mercy to the world. Amen.

## **MAIN THEME & VERSE(S)**

Key Theme: Sacraments and Sacramentals... saint-making machines.

As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. (He said), "While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." After saying this, he spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put it on the man's eyes. "Go," he told him, "wash in the Pool of Siloam" (this word means "Sent"). ## HOLY STAIRS - RICHARD LINDSLEY

#### 3 Mysteries to the Miraculous Staircase

- Who Built It... The Sisters of Loretto believe that \_\_\_\_\_\_ came from heaven, worked for 3 months, miraculously got materials, and built this masterpiece.
- 2. Engineering Masterpiece... architects believe that the spiral staircase structure is impossible! They have no idea how it remains standing.

#### **CHIMAYO - VIVIAN SCHAEGEL**

God takes our dirt and makes it holy.

A \_\_\_\_\_\_ is a sacred journey to a holy place. It's also a sacrificial offering we can make to God for loved ones or specific intentions as we go.

The story of Chimayo begins in the 1800s when a friar saw a light coming from a hill and he went to check it out. Once he realized it was coming from the ground, he dug and found a \_\_\_\_\_.

The crazy thing about this story is that no matter how many times it was removed, it miraculously ended up back in it's original location. And today, that location is known as the Lourdes, France of the United States and has multiple miracles attributed to it.

Since the crucifix was found in the dirt, people started associating them together and believe the dirt is holy. The dirt is now used in blessings!

As a Catholic Church, we have physical, tangible expressions of our faith because we are body AND soul. God became flesh and met us where we're at. Jesus left us a visible Church with sacraments. He wants us to have tangible encounters with him. And he does all of this because he loves us.

#### **FR. JOSEPH DEANE**

Fr. Joseph was raised Catholic, fell away, and then came back. And not only came back... but he answered the call to be a Franciscan friar!

- Is there an awesome sacramental you could start to make a bigger part of your life? Maybe hang a crucifix in a prominent place? Get a bottle of holy water to carry with you? Have a rosary with you at all times? The possibilities are endless!



## PRAYER

As you close in prayer, start by thanking God for what you are most grateful for today. It's so easy to forget to express gratitude for all the blessings He has given us.

Next, share with the group special prayer intentions that are on your heart. Remember Jesus tells us "where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in their midst.

Finally, spend one minute in silence and let the whisper of God soak into your soul.

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. How do you approach the sacrament of Reconciliation? Would you say you approach the sacrament with guilt and share or joy and thanksgiving? It's okay and understandable if you struggle with it at times... be honest and work to overcome this and receive the gift of grace and forgiveness with a full heart.
- 2. What are your feelings toward the rosary? Is it a prayer that you find beauty and depth in or monotony and repetition? The rosary is a gift for all! If you struggle with the rosary, get to the root of the struggle and strive to see the beauty of this spiritual gift.
- 3. How much do you turn to your guardian angel? They have been assigned to you specifically to light your way, guard you, and guide you through the storms of life. Do you really believe this? If not, how can you start to be more open to the guidance of your guardian angel?
- 4. When life gets stressful how do you respond? Prayer? Worry? Despair? How can you practically turn to God in times of trial?

## SIMPLE SUMMARY

No poverty compares to the poverty we saw in Haiti. In this episode, we got a glimpse of what extreme physical poverty looks like. But despite the great material needs that the people of Haiti experience, we can learn so much from their resilient faith in the midst of so many trials.

The only thing more overwhelming than the poverty in Haiti is the indomitable spirit of the Haitian people. Nothing can stop these amazing people.

## SEAN FORREST AND THE ORPHANAGE

"God, what do you really want me to do?" That was the question that led Sean away from the life of a bar musician and to the life of a missionary.

When Sean felt that God was calling him to something more in life, a trip to Haiti changed his life forever. In particular, an encounter with holding a child at an orphanage inspired him to take action in helping those most in need.

Sean helped found Haiti 180 which strives to serve the poorest of the poor from the head to the heart to, most importantly, the soul.

## **CHRIS MONOLOGUE**

The best word to describe the spirit of Haiti is "anfom" which means \_\_\_\_\_\_. There is strong... and then there is Haiti strong!

There's something unconquerable in the Haitian spirit... HOPE. And that hope comes from the Resurrection of Christ Jesus.

#### **DAY 2**

Among a people so materially poor... they are wealthy in what matters most: faith.

Christian service was on full display throughout this episode. In terms of service, it's so important we don't view the people as objects of our service, but rather that we see them as our \_\_\_\_\_

\_\_\_\_\_\_ in Christ. We're equals. We're family. And we're just doing what a family does.

What we saw at the retirement home was truly remarkable. The missionaries at first took in neglected elderly in what they believed would be a hospice care facility. But quickly they found that these elderly had so much more joyful life to share once they were loved again.

We saw an impressive medical clinic that was beginning to take shape. Sean explained how God revealed the medical clinic in WAVES.

#### JOHN SIMONE

The missionaries had cared for John for a year and a half since his tragic accident and have done so with great love the entire journey.

Despite his difficult circumstances, it was so easy to see the face of Jesus in the face of John Simone. And why is this? John said that in his time of suffering, he has simply reflected on Jesus and that brings happiness to his heart.

Chris felt like he was walking into a \_\_\_\_\_\_ when he walked into John's home. He encountered Jesus and never is going to forget that face.

#### DAY 4

God owns \_\_\_\_\_\_. The one who has everything chose to humble Himself and be with us. Why? Because he loves us.

As Christians, it's precisely our belief in heaven that should drive us to do good on this earth.

#### CLOSING

Mother Teresa said of all the poverty she had encountered in the world, the worst poverty was found in wealthy nations... It's the poverty of loneliness. It's the poverty feeling your life makes no difference. It's the poverty of despair and hopelessness. We all have the power to push back on this poverty. We simply must commit to doing little things with great love.

Let's step out of our comfort zone and put the values of the Gospel into action! That is the mark of a Real Life Catholic.



## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. Conversion is a beautiful thing. Sometimes conversion is gradual and other times it's almost immediate. Would you say that you've had a conversion experience? If so, please share. If not, reflect on the fact that we are called to conversion of heart every single day.
- 2. Seeing the poverty that we saw in Haiti... what does that do to your heart?
- 3. Reflect on James 1:2-4... "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing." How does this verse apply to the people we saw in Haiti? How does this apply to YOUR life?
- 4. Service... it's something that bonds us together as humans. How would you describe the heart of those who we saw in the video who were serving? Who was being more blessed... the ones who served or the ones who were served?



## **PUTTING IT TO PRACTICE**

Getting outside of yourself is the key to happiness. We are all members of the mystical Body of Christ and we depend on each other. Service is at the heart of what it means to be a Real Life Catholic. When we serve, our faith has gone from our head... to our heart... to our sleeves.

So... what is something you can do in the next week that is an intentional act of service? It's doesn't have to be groundbreaking. It just needs to be genuine. Commit to at least one loving act of service. Share it with the group... and make sure you follow through!

# **BEFORE LEAVING**

# HOST A SMALL GROUP ON YOUR OWN

Yes you can! Yes, you. You can. Here's how.

### **INVITE AND INCLUDE OTHERS**

Just invite someone (or, some several ones), and include them. Seems simple right? Well, it is. Life isn't meant to be lived alone. That's why the following is meant to help you invite and include others in your journey to Unshakeable Joy: after all, shouldn't others live that kind of joy too!?

So why not be a host of a small group yourself? To be a host in this sense is simple: just invite some others to go on this journey with you. You don't have to be any kind of expert. You just have to be willing. And have the courage to put yourself out there for your God.

#### THE CHEETOS PRINCIPLE TO INVITATION

**STEP 1:** Go to the grocery store and buy some Spicy Cheetos.

**STEP 2:** Call a friend/neighbor/co-worker and say: "Hey. I've got some Spicy Cheetos. You should come over and have some with me."...don't worry, they'll come, because...Spicy Cheetos!

**STEP 3:** Eat some Spicy Cheetos (be sure to share some with your friend/neighbor/co-worker), and then - at some point - say, "Hey brother/sister, not only are these Spicy Cheetos really good; but, how ARE you? As in, really...how're you doing?"

STEP 4: Listen - really listen - and love on your friend.

**STEP 5:** Then DO this small group program! We've written it for you!

The point is...inviting someone to spend time with you is simple. Don't overcomplicate it!

If you have two friends, you can start a group (Matthew 18:20). You don't need training. There are no formal requirements. You just need to lean into a certain generosity of spirit, and to have a heart for others.

#### SOME WAYS TO INVITE OTHERS

- Shoot them a text
- Send an email.
- Leave a brief message on the Facebook account.
- Send an e-card.
- Call them!
- Or, actually invite them face-to-face!

### **FEAR NOT**

Fear keeps a lot of people from starting faith communities, and from sharing their faith in general. Don't let your fear mug your aspirations! Cast your fear on Christ and let Him transform it (1 Peter 5:7). This is your ONE life: live it well. Live it boldly!

There are three main wordly fears that keep people from saying YES to Christ's call in their lives and they are in direct opposition to the three evangelical counsels.

- 1. Fear of not getting their needs met...what do you need to give up for the Kingdom? (poverty)
- Fear of not belonging..who do we really want to belong to anyway? (chastity)
- 3 Fear of losing control...do we trust God's will for our lives? (obedience)

All other fears can be drawn back to these three. The Devil even tried to tempt Christ with these in the desert (Matthew 4: 1-11). Don't let the devil keep you down! If you are feeling that tug to be in a small group, ask the Holy Spirit to flood your heart with courage and invite a friend.

# FEARS AROUND STARTING, HOSTING OR JOINING A SMALL GROUP

*My house isn't clean enough...* neither are the homes of your friends, believe me.

*I don't have the right gifts...* share the responsibilities, talk to a few friends and work together to share the load.

*What if no one says yes?...* Keep asking, they might be overwhelmed with life. Ask if there is something you can do to make life easier.

I **don't know how to manage conversations...** You don't need to! Who wants a "managed" conversation anyway? God desires us to be real with one another: He'll equip you...if you let Him.

*I don't know enough...* Who does? It's OK not to know. Your role isn't to provide answers, to educate, or even to furnish information...answers to questions can always be looked up. While no question is off-limits, your role is better understood as someone who wants to help facilitate faith-filled conversations. Trust God enough to let Him guide the conversation.

*I don't live like others in my parish...* People didn't all live the same in the early Church. When we love each other, we don't judge each other by the size or style of our homes. St. Paul tells us that he learned the secret of being hungry and well-fed. We too can learn to live according to our circumstances with humility (Phil 4:12)!

### **CREATING THE EXPERIENCE**

#### **ROOM SETUP**

Everything in your room communicates a tone and feeling. Try to arrange things so people feel comfortable, and are able to look at one another face-to-face when talking. Food and something to drink is always welcome. We suggest re-discovering the joys of a potluck! The more you can make a room feel like home for someone else, the more comfortable your group will be and the more likely others will feel happy there.

#### HOW TO BE...AND BEHAVE

One of the primary reasons a person wants to engage in a small group discussion is to be heard...and that means meaningful conversation. So try to be mindful of that. Here are some ways to help:

- When you get started, open each session with getting a sense from others about how they're really doing. Check in with them. Greet people at the door with a smile to set the tone right away. Be friendly and be yourself...you have permission!
- Don't do all the talking...help facilitate the conversation rather than dominate it. Cast a vision for a conversation, don't kill it. Your role isn't to educate or furnish information. That is talking to people. Strive to talk with them instead. Give them the space to be heard. Consider writing down things you want to share on your own paper and holding the thought. Give conversation...time.
- 3. Be comfortable with silence and uncertainty. Meaningful conversations require some level of silence: it's where thought often occurs (not everyone is an exterior processor of their thoughts), and it's the space in which the thunder of God's still, small voice of hope is very often heard (1 Kings 19 1-18).
- 4. Be a good listener. A good listener is quick to listen (James 1:19). A good listener is an active listener. A good listener listens with his or her eyes as well ears. "If you love to listen, you will receive; and If you pay attention, you will be wise" (Sirach 6:33).
- 5. Encourage everyone to be involved in the conversation by listening well and involving others (but don't insist everyone must speak!). If your group is too big for everyone to be involved in the conversation, break it up into multiple groups. And let people wander between groups as their interests dictate.
- 6. Don't rush! The point is not to get through any certain volume of material. The point is to take the time together to let God reveal the purpose of a conversation (which very often results in people finding their life's purpose in His plan).
- 7. Pray. Pray before anyone arrives so you can welcome them well. Pray before anyone leaves so you leave in His presence. And pray between meetings for one another's intentions. Prayer is not the place to hold back.

Remember—you don't need to have all the answers to host this study. Hosting is about helping others have helpful conversations about faith. If that happens, it's a win!

#### HAVE A COMMUNICATION PLAN

Help people continue the experience by checking in with the people in your group throughout the time between when you get together.

- 1. Send a text message to everyone in your group. Let them know you're praying for them. Just because.
- 2. Send a text message to anyone who couldn't make it. Let them know you missed them! And let them know you look forward to seeing them next time.
- 3. Send a text to at least one person in your group and ask them what you can pray about for them.
- 4. Post a message on your social media page. Post a message on their social media page. Let folks know how much you enjoy their company! And how much you look forward to spending more time with them.
- 5. Email your group every week (if you meet weekly), with a reminder of when your small group is next meeting, and where, and any other information they may need (e.g., "You all bring something else to eat, I've got the Spicy Cheetos!").

### A NOTE ON THE IMPORTANCE OF SMALL GROUP RELATIONSHIPS

We don't think we can say it better than Nelson Searcy and Kerrick Thomas did in their book *Activate*:

Most of the people...are looking for social relationships. They want to meet casual friends. They are looking for some people to hang out with, because they know instinctively that within that group of people they're likely to meet someone they want to get personal with and invite into their inner circle. Then, from that inner circle, they can decide who they want to be in intimate relationship with. Instead of being forced into contrived familiarity, they just want to be given an opportunity to connect with new people so that deeper relationships can develop naturally.

Allow casual friendships to develop without feeling a need to force intimacy.

Most (parish) leaders have made two critical mistakes in trying to help people connect. First, we have undersold the importance of basic friendships and social relationships to overall spiritual health. Second, we have oversold the importance of personal and intimate relationships—and we have tried to force our small group members into such relationships, even though groups are naturally structured to accommodate social, not personal or intimate connections. People simply do not get personal or intimate in groups of eight to fifteen people. They socialize in groups of eight to fifteen people. When we try to force more intimate relationships in our groups, we scare and alienate many potential group members, especially men. No man is going to sign up for a group if he thinks he is going to have to let people he doesn't know that well into his personal business. But men (and women) will sign up for groups where they can meet new friends, connect with God, and hang out socially.
